As part of their responsibility for managing the Queen Elizabeth Hall the committee are committed to protecting and enhancing the environment and to raising awareness and understanding of environmental issues within the local community. They will therefore, endeavour, within the scope of the constitution, to:

- Promote ways of mitigating and adapting to global warming
- Encourage strategies that support the reduction of carbon emissions
- Conserve fossil fuels, peat and other non-sustainable materials
- Promote and adopt appropriate ways to reduce water and energy usage
- Take into account natural resource considerations when procuring goods, materials and services for the hall
- Encourage the purchase of goods and services for the hall that cause the least harm to the environment
- Protect and enhance the quality of the hall environs
- Identify, monitor and seek to reduce use of pollutants in the hall
- Comply with local arrangements for recycling of hall waste and items surplus to its needs
- Comply with environmental legislation
- Share the outcomes and experiences gained from the choices made in relation to this environmental policy
- Help the community reduce car journeys by providing resources and services in the hall when possible
